Jeju Island, Korea's largest island is only an hour's flight from Seoul. Jeju Island has fascinating seashore, which takes pride in the beauty of its oddly shaped rocks, waterfalls, white sandy beaches and numerous small islands. Most tourist sites on Jeju Island are concentrated along the coast, so it is easy and fun to travel on the coast road. Jeju Island has a variety of unique geographic attractions from scattered hills, vast plains, to peculiar volcanic landscapes. Korean people like to compare Jeju Island with Hawaii. Like Hawaii, Jeju Island was created by a volcanic eruption and many parts of the island are covered with dark volcanic rocks, sand and soil. Jeju Island has more exotic natural surroundings and scenic splendors than anywhere else in Korea.





* **Yongduam**

Yongduam Rock & Yongyeon Pond are highly recommended late night driving courses.

Yongduam Rock, known as one of Jeju Island's main attractions, is a group of strangely-shaped rocks rising 10m high on the western coast of Jeju City. The rocks are shaped like the head of a dragon that is about to fly off. According to an early Korean legend, a dragon that came to steal a jade ball from Mt. Halla was shot by an arrow that belonged to the god living in the mountain. The injured dragon sunk into the sea but raised its head which was locked permanently while staring into the sky.

* **Jeju Nature & Folklore Museum**

Jeju Nature & Folklore Museum has an extensive collection of the island's unique folk and natural materials.

At the entrance is an enormous mounting of a 8.6m long shark, a 4.7m wide ray, and a whale weighing 4t that attracts the public right away. The museum is divided into 4 different exhibition halls with the theme of nature display, folklore display, special display, etc. showing a total of over 3,000 relics of the past. There is also a room screening/showing visual materials 4 times a day as well as an outdoor display.

* **Oedolgae**

Oedolgae that floats offshore of Sammaebong Seougwipo City is an amazing rock with 10 metres in circumference and 20 metres in height and is also known as the Changuun Rock. It is surrounded by beautiful islands such as Bum Island, Sae Island and Seonnyu(fairy) Rock. Oedolgae was also a filming location in 2003 TV drama series, 'Daejangguem' where Hansangoong(Mee Kyung Yang) faced her death under a false accusation while being carried on Daejangguem's(Young Ae Lee) back. Fantastic rocks of Oedolgae and fields of reeds in the

extensive ranch is a perfect place to go trekking. The sunset of Bum Island which can be seen from Oedolgae has long been an essential course for tourists to Jeju Island.

* **National Museum**

Opened on June 15, 2001 Jeju National Museum is a historical museum that display, preserve and study Jeju Island's history and cultural assets. Jeju National Museum houses various remains excavated from ruins including meaningful relics from the prehistoric age through Chosun Dynasty. It boasts unique traditional culture and holds special exhibitions each year.

* **Cheonjeyeon Waterfall**

Cheonjeyeon Waterfall, named 'The pond of God', consists of 3 parts. Around the falls, there are rare plants such as 'solipnan' reeds. There is a cave in the east and from the ceiling cold water pours down creating the waterfall. The water from the first waterfall becomes the second and third waterfalls and flows into the sea.

* **Seongeup Folk Village**

If Jeju Folk Village recreated the living quarters of Jeju's people, Seongeup Folk Village is the actual living place of Jeju residents.

Located 8km above the coast, Seongeup Folk Village shows the characteristics of old commoners' houses and traditional lifestyles of Jeju in a straightforward manner. It preserves the unique culture of Jeju Island just as it is. Also, there are Jeju natives living in each of the houses who will personally show you around the village.
